In response to your application for permit renewal dated October 12, 2016, received on October 16, 2016 and completed on October 26, 2016, I hereby issue to the above-mentioned holder, in accordance with section 70.11 of the *Environment Quality Act* (CQLR, chapter Q-2), the permit covering the activity described below:

Transport of dangerous residual material to a disposal site. The transported material shall be solid, liquid or semi-solid and belong to the categories stipulated in Schedule 4 of the *Hazardous Materials Regulation*, with the exception of explosive or radioactive material and objects.

The vehicles used to transport the dangerous residual material shall be kept on lot 4,043,276 of the cadastre of Quebec, at street address 795 Lucien-Beaudin in the municipality of Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, regional county municipality of Haut-Richelieu.
